So to kick start these celebrations and help us raise some much needed funds we held a Sunday Lunch at the Italian Club at the end of September


We have also introduced changes to the format of our newsletter, so that while we will continue to promote and report on events in our community, the lead articles will concentrate on OGI related news and issues.



It's all confirmed, for 2020 OGI is being held at the Watford Leisure complex which includes the Woodside Athletics Stadium. home to the Watford Harriers.

The stadium has a newly laid 400m, 8 lane, floodlit all weather track, with a 700 seater stand. On the infield there are two javelin, two long jump, discus and shot put areas, all visible from the stand. While the adjacent leisure centre boasts a 25m 8 lane swimming pool, complete with electronic timing and four floodlit 4G 5 aside football pitches and parking for over 300 cars, coaches and 3 mini buses.

Unfortunately, not everything has been finalised, as we are still negotiating with Watford Harriers for them to supply and operate the photo finishing equipment and we are still looking for a local venue to stage our netball tournament but we are hopeful that this will all be sorted by the end of the year.

Following our consultation with the team managers, it has been decided that for 2020 the football tournament will be expanded to include boys up to the age of 16 years old.

As a result of the extra time needed to stage the tournament, it will now be held on the Sunday, rather than the Monday and it will more than likely last all day. This means, that apart from some of the oldest boys, almost all the track & field events for Sunday will be given over to the girls.

Each team will be allowed to enter one five a-side team, consisting of one goalkeeper, four outfield players and two substitutes, per age group. Each age group will play in a league, with medals being awarded according to who finishes in the top three places, once all the games in that league are played.

All other rules and regulations will be as they are set out in the current OGI rule book.

OGIC has decided to introduce a limit on the number of swimmers which each team is allowed to enter.

Having studied previous years, it was noted that all the that the gala gets underway quicker and hopefully if it teams had a drop out rate, depending on age group, finishes sooner, be able to present medals at the end of ranging from as low as 33% to as high as 75%,

with the average across the board being 44%. It has therefore been decided that for OGI 2020, the number of swimmers which each team may enter in the gala, will be set at 60% of the total number of competitors which they have registered to compete in OGI on 30/04/2020.

After six years at the helm and three OGI games, the St. Peter's youth club committee decided that it was time for it to relinquish control and so it was that at the 1984 AGM the new independent OGI committee was formed. However, the links with the Youth Club would remain, with the newly elected President Les Rickard and nearly 50% of the committee coming from it's ranks but they were being joined by likes of Armo & Rob Collini, Marie Tissi and Piero Schia to name four. And this new committee would make an immediate impact, with Rob Collini writing a software package that would see the registration process, events scheduling and recording of results computerised.

The 1986 games were held for the first time at the New River Stadium. St. Peter's, as if now liberated from the yoke of having to run the games, won their first title and Harrow & Wembley winning the Sportsmanship Cup. Sadly, for both St. Peter's and OGI, 1986 was also marred by the sad loss of Les Rickard.

Armo Collini became President and to commemorate Les, the OGI committee would introduce The Les Rickard Trophy. Apart from the new trophy, the 1998 games will be remembered for four reasons; firstly the three days of almost solid rain. Secondly, Southgate winning their first title. Thirdly, Willesden & Brent, with the ever cheerful Gregorio Chiparo leading them, winning the Sportsmanship Trophy and lastly, possibly most importantly, the almost immortal Stanmore & Hendon team. Not just because it finished second and won the inaugural Les Rickard Trophy, but because it would go on to dominate OGI for the next eight years, winning an historic four consecutive titles, a record which still stands today.

Piero Schia started his tenure as President for the 1990 games, with Stanmore & Hendon winning their first of four titles, Harrow & Wembley winning The Les Rickard Trophy and Lunigiana the Sportsmanship Cup.

1992 saw Stanmore once again crowned champions, with St. Albans winning the Les Rickard Trophy and Arrotini their first Sportsmanship Cup. 1994 witnessed another masterclass performance by Stanmore & Hendon as they won their third title in a row, with Scalabrini winning the Sportsmanship Cup. Hoddesdon, a large team who had taken part in OGI from the beginning, gave Stanmore & Hendon a good run for their money, finishing second and winning the Les Rickard Trophy. Surprisingly this was to be their one and only trophy.

Livio Spagnoli succeeded Piero as President for 1996 and these games saw photo finishing, independently operated by AAA officials, introduced for the first time. The unstoppable Stanmore & Hendon juggernaut would win their fourth and last title, with Southgate coming second and winning the Les Rickard Trophy and Arrotini winning their second Sportsmanship Cup.

1998 saw Stanmore & Hendon's championship reign come to an end. After three hard fought days, St. Peter's triumphed winning their second title, with Arrotini achieving a unique and never repeated double of winning both the Les Rickard Trophy and Sportsmanship Cup. However, 1998 will be remembered not for what happened at the games but at that year's AGM. With competitor numbers decreasing, fundraising proving increasingly difficult and funds diminishing, the committee decided that it was time for new blood to take over and resigned en-masse.

OGI had reached it's Rubicon, either it would survive and rise, phoenix like, from the flames or wither and die.

Non Italian Club Athletes

With OGI fast approaching, it is important that all team managers carry out regular checks on their non Italian competitors to ensure that they are not Club Athletes and keep a record of all their checks.

OGI's rule 2.4 defines a club athlete as follows: "For the purpose of OGI, an individual whose name or details appear on any database or reference site, which is operated or recognised by either UK Athletics or British Swimming, including any of their subsidiaries, will be classified as being a Club Athlete. Irrespective of whether the individual is or has ever been a member of an athletics or swimming club."

It doesn't matter whether the competitor has competed in previous OGI's or that the entry dates back years, if their details appear, they will be ineligible to compete.

If you're not sure about somebody, either check with us first or withdraw the competitor. A team will face no penalties for withdrawing someone before OGI has started but could face severe penalties if a competitor is found to be a club athlete once the games are underway.


